## Bloomfield Social and Youth Services: Support for Families and Individuals

The Bloomfield Social and Youth Services Department acts as



the primary social safety net and empowerment hub for the town. Staffed by a team of professionally trained social workers, the department provides confidential services and programs aimed at promoting the well-being of all residents, from children and youth to adults and families facing a variety of needs.

### **Comprehensive Individual and Family Services**

The department's core function is to assess individual and family needs and provide direct assistance or connect residents to the appropriate resources, often serving as navigators for complex state and regional services.

#### **Key Assistance and Outreach Areas:**

- **Individualized Needs Assessment:** Social workers conduct private consultations to determine a resident's specific needs, whether at the office or through telephone consultation, and develop action plans to secure necessary aid.
- **Financial Assistance:** Assisting residents in navigating and applying for state and local financial aid programs, including help with applications for housing, energy assistance (heating bills), and government-issued benefits.
- **Food Security:** Managing the local **Bloomfield Food Bank** (with specific operating hours) and connecting eligible families to programs like Mobile Foodshare and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
- **Health and Wellness:** Offering support and information for housing options, home health care, mental health resources, and long-term care plans. The department also provides counseling through a certified **CHOICES counselor** to assist seniors with complex Medicare options.
- **Child and Family Support:** Providing inter-agency referrals and direct resources for child care, including the **Care 4 Kids** program, **Diaper Bank** services, and the **Family Resource Center (FRC)**, which supports caregivers with child development information.

#### **Empowering Bloomfield Youth**

The Youth Services division focuses on positive youth development, leadership, and employment readiness for Bloomfield children and adolescents.

#### **Youth Development and Training Programs:**

- **Project 330:** A leadership group for high school students (Grades 8–12) committed to community service, advocacy, and building skills in areas like financial literacy and entrepreneurship.
- **Summer Youth Employment & Learning Program (SYELP):** A key workforce development initiative, in partnership with Capital Workforce Partners, that offers **paid work experience** and career exploration opportunities for youth aged 14–17 during the summer months.
- **Leadership and Mentorship:** Programs such as **Mini Sunbeams** (for Grades 2–5) focus on collaboration, self-confidence, and social-emotional skills, while groups like the

**Juvenile Review Board (JRB)** provide community-based diversion for youth facing minor legal issues.

- **Police-Youth Group:** A program focused on leadership, team-building, and community service that partners youth with the Bloomfield Police Department.

The Social and Youth Services Department, located in the Alvin & Beatrice Wood Human Services Center, serves as a comprehensive resource hub, working to empower all residents to lead healthy, productive, and stable lives within the Bloomfield community.

## **Aging in Place Safely Grant: Minor Home Repair Assistance**

The Minority Construction Council is pleased to announce the Aging in Place Safely Grant Program, designed with the goal of "Keeping Our Seniors Happy, Healthy and Whole!"



This grant program offers assistance to seniors with minor home repairs, providing up to \$5,000 for eligible households.

### **Grant Application Details**

Application Period: The grant application period is from October 15 to December 1, 2025.

Eligible Areas: The grant is available to seniors who live in one of the following towns: Bloomfield, East Hartford, Hartford, West Hartford, and Windsor.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

To be eligible for the grant, you must meet all the requirements below and be able to submit the necessary documentation as proof of eligibility:

Age: All household members must be 65 years old or older.

Household Size: The household must have only 1-2 Seniors living in the home.

Annual Income: You must have proof of Annual Income below the limits:

1 Senior: \$39,761  
2 Seniors: \$51,996

Home Ownership: You must have proof of home ownership, such as a Deed, Mortgage Statement, or Current Home Tax Bill.

## CT Automatic Admission Program: Earn Good Grades, Get Into College

Governor Ned Lamont is reminding high school students about the Connecticut Automatic Admission Program (CAAP), which guarantees admission to 10 participating colleges and universities for seniors with at least a 3.0 weighted GPA or 2.75 unweighted GPA. The program streamlines the process with one simple application, no fees, no essays, and no recommendation letters required. Applications for the 2026–2027 academic year are open now through May 1, 2026.
