The Bloomfield Minibus: Essential Shared-Ride Transportation for Seniors and Disabled Residents

The Bloomfield Minibus is a crucial public transportation service managed by the Town of Bloomfield's Senior Services Department, providing affordable and reliable shared-ride access to essential destinations for the community's eligible residents.



Eligibility and Purpose

The Minibus system is a specialized service, not a general public transit line. It is dedicated to supporting the mobility of those who may have difficulty using traditional transportation methods.

Primary Ridership Includes:

- **Seniors:** Any Bloomfield resident age 60 and older.
- **Medically Eligible Residents:** Persons age 21 and older who can provide proof of disability and a qualifying medical need for the service.

The primary function of the Minibus is to ensure residents can access vital services, promoting health and independence. The curb-to-curb service transports individuals for:

- **Medical Appointments:** Both within Bloomfield and to external facilities in surrounding towns, including West Hartford, Hartford, Farmington, and UConn Health Center.
- **Essential Errands:** Grocery shopping, banking, and pharmacy visits within the town.
- **Social & Wellness:** Attendance at programs and activities offered by the Senior Center.
- **Note:** The service is strictly for essential and non-work-related travel.

Operational Details

The Minibus operates on a consistent weekday schedule, designed to cover peak needs for appointments and errands:

- **Schedule:** Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.
- **Holidays:** The service is closed on Town-recognized holidays.

Accessing the Service

To utilize the Bloomfield Minibus, residents must complete a two-step enrollment and booking process:

Enrollment and Cost

- **Application:** New riders must complete a Mini Bus Application and an emergency information form, which is submitted to the Senior Services Department.
- **Annual Fee:** There is a \$40.00 annual subscription fee to become a member and utilize the service throughout the year.

Booking a Trip

- **Advance Notice is Key:** As a shared-ride system, reservations are mandatory and must be called in at least 24 hours in advance. Same-day booking is not possible.
- **Shared Schedule:** Riders must be flexible and ready for their pickup at the curb. Because the bus is pooling multiple riders into one route, passengers are asked to be ready up to 30 minutes before and after their scheduled time to accommodate the route's travel time variations.

The Bloomfield Minibus remains an indispensable resource, acting as a crucial link that helps connect the town's senior and disabled population to necessary services and the broader community.



Author Talk: "Bloomfield and the Filleys in the Civil War"

Join us for an engaging evening with author Rick Cochran, who will present his newest historical novel, *True to His Country: A Civil War Novel*. This special program, "Bloomfield and the Filleys in the Civil War," explores how the national conflict of the 1860s touched the lives of local families — including the Filleys, one of Bloomfield's most storied names.

Cochran's novel draws on family letters, diaries, and extensive historical research to tell the intertwined stories of Charles Taylor and Charlotte Filley Taylor, whose experiences reflect both the immigrant journey and the trials of wartime life. Charlotte emigrated from Ulster in 1850, settling in Bloomfield after losing her parents at sea, while Charles served four years in the 10th Connecticut Volunteer Infantry Regiment during the Civil War. Their relationship — marked by love, duty, and the moral questions of a divided nation — offers a deeply personal view of how families like the Filleys experienced the era's upheaval.



Rick Cochran's *True to His Country* is more than a war story — it's a portrait of Connecticut life in the 19th century. Through authentic period detail and voices drawn from real correspondence, Cochran brings to life the courage and sacrifices of everyday people whose stories shaped our shared history. Kirkus Reviews praised the book for its emotional honesty and vivid portrayal of local history, noting that Cochran "rises to the challenge... through this small slice of its effects on his ancestors."

This is a wonderful opportunity to explore Bloomfield's history, hear directly from the author, and gain new insight into how national events shaped our town's past. Space is limited, so be sure to register early at bplct.org.

Aging in Place Safely Grant: Minor Home Repair Assistance

The Minority Construction Council is pleased to announce the Aging in Place Safely Grant Program, designed with the goal of "Keeping Our Seniors Happy, Healthy and Whole!"

This grant program offers assistance to seniors with minor home repairs, providing up to \$5,000 for eligible households.

Grant Application Details

Application Period: The grant application period is from October 15 to December 1, 2025.



Eligible Areas: The grant is available to seniors who live in one of the following towns: Bloomfield, East Hartford, Hartford, West Hartford, and Windsor.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the grant, you must meet all the requirements below and be able to submit the necessary documentation as proof of eligibility:

Age: All household members must be 65 years old or older.

Household Size: The household must have only 1-2 Seniors living in the home.

Annual Income: You must have proof of Annual Income below the limits:

1 Senior: \$39,761

2 Seniors: \$51,996

Home Ownership: You must have proof of home ownership, such as a Deed, Mortgage Statement, or Current Home Tax Bill.

CT Automatic Admission Program: Earn Good Grades, Get Into College

Governor Ned Lamont is reminding high school students about the Connecticut Automatic Admission Program (CAAP), which guarantees admission to 10 participating colleges and universities for seniors with at least a 3.0 weighted GPA or 2.75 unweighted GPA. The program streamlines the process with one simple application, no fees, no essays, and no recommendation letters required. Applications for the 2026–2027 academic year are open now through May 1, 2026.
