

The beginning of Spring marks the conclusion of this Town Council's first 100 days. I am happy to report on the tremendous strides we've made to continue to build Bloomfield and cultivate a thriving community to live, work and play!

Major Rockwell Park Investment - \$4,000,000

Since joining the Council in 2019, the redevelopment of Rockwell Park has been a major priority that would revitalize the Blue Hills neighborhood, expand recreational opportunities for our youth and healthy spaces for all residents, drive business development on the Eastside, and enhance property values. Just this March, we secured a \$4M grant from the State to launch these efforts! This \$4M is a huge downpayment towards the total Master Park Plan for Rockwell of ~\$12M. This project is truly transformative.

Bicycle Friendly Community & the East Coast Greenway

With the Town Council's focus on connecting our entire community with each other and emphasizing safe biking and walking, our town has made progress in completing the implementation plan for the East Coast Greenway. We have formally endorsed the bike trail route through Bloomfield. We have also endorsed Bloomfield becoming a Bicycle Friendly Community, a national designation promoting safer streets, investments in infrastructure, reducing traffic congestion, economic benefits, environmental sustainability and improving quality of life. We are proud to join neighboring towns in fostering a greener, more connected future!

Town Center Economic Development Authority & Town Center Planning Grant - \$250,000

Another achievement! The Town Council secured a \$250,000 state grant to support the designing and planning activities that will play a crucial role in revitalizing our town center, creating a vibrant and welcoming space for residents and visitors alike. This investment will not only enhance the physical infrastructure but also contribute to the economic growth and cultural vibrancy of our community.

In addition, the Town Council created a Town Center Economic Development Authority of community stakeholders charged with evaluating strategies to address the challenges of creating a sustainable town center by identifying the following: creating walkable environments, broadening housing choices, offering mobility options, mixing land uses, enhancing civic and cultural presence, and increasing diversity. We look forward to the positive changes that will result from the work of this new Authority and the legacy a redeveloped Town Center will have on our Town!

Appointed Town Charter Revision Commission (Our Town Constitution)

2006 was the last time the Town reviewed and updated the Bloomfield Town Charter! As a result, the Town Council recently appointed a diverse group of community stakeholders to ensure that the Town Charter remains a dynamic and responsive document that reflects the community's values, promotes effective governance, and serves the best interests of all residents. By engaging in the charter revision process, we can strengthen our governance structures, enhance civic engagement, and build a stronger foundation for the future. Stay tuned for more information on this. Your input will be critical to this process.

Importance of updating our zoning ordinances

In addition to updating our municipal Constitution, we have also started updating our town zoning ordinances which is essential for ensuring that our land use regulations are aligned with current needs, goals and best practices. By regularly reviewing and revising zoning regulations, we can create an inclusive and resilient built environment that meets the housing & business development goals of today and support future generations to come.

Establishment of Affordable Housing Trust Fund

The Council recently created an ordinance establishing a Housing Trust Fund. This fund will be a vital tool in addressing housing affordability and rehabilitation, promoting economic diversity, preventing displacement, supporting workforce stability and fostering community development. The plan is to link private and public development fees as the primary source of funding to create a lasting impact that won't raise your taxes.

Gratitude

As we embark on this new season, let us also take time to appreciate the blessings of our town, the support of our neighbors, and the strength of our community.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve as your mayor and to witness the positive impact we can make when we work together towards common goals. Let's keep up the great momentum we are experiencing and let's make 2024 a year of unity, kindness, and progress.

ROCKWELL PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Mayor Wong and Senator McCrory Applaud Historic Award of Rockwell Park Funding of \$4 Million



BLOOMFIELD, CT – The State of Connecticut Community Investment Fund 2030 Board announced its fourth round of projects and amongst these awards was a \$4,000,000 grant for improvements to Bloomfield's Rockwell Park.

Town of Bloomfield Mayor Danielle C. Wong and Connecticut State Senator Douglas McCrory have been working in tandem on funding for this project, which was developed to address the need for park improvements and the revitalization of the Blue Hills neighborhood.

"This has been the culmination of over four years of intentional work and advocacy. I want to thank the Community Investment Fund Board, along with Senator McCrory and our State Legislative Delegation, for providing the Town of Bloomfield with the funding it needs to help revitalize Rockwell Park and the Blue Hills neighborhood," said Wong. "This announcement will help us bring new light to Rockwell, transforming a well-known park into a new gathering place by bringing the community and surrounding communities together through both active and passive recreation."

"I also want to thank our Director of Parks, Recreation, & Leisure Services Dave Melesko, as well as our Rockwell Park Planning Committee, chaired by Lynette Easmon, and includes members James Jenkins, Kimberly Dunbar, Renae James, and Gail Nolan," Wong added.

Located on the eastside of Bloomfield, this project will have a direct impact on the neighborhood in which there are nearly 700 homes within walking distance and who are the primary target population, but it will also serve and attract the greater community of 21,535 residents bringing in needed investment and spending to the neighborhood.

"This grant from the Community Investment Fund is a clear win for kids and families from the Blue Hills neighborhood who will benefit from a revitalized Rockwell Park," Senator McCrory said. "Thanks to the combined efforts of the Bloomfield Legislative Delegation and Mayor Wong, our residents will have access to safe and well-lit sports facilities, giving members of our community more opportunities to engage in active, healthy activities."

This project addresses the needs of the community by adding new outdoor basketball courts coupled with lighting, park gathering space and structures, additional community gardens, dedicated safe space walking paths and safety lighting, exercise stations, a playscape, and more.

A groundbreaking ceremony for the project will take place later this spring.

The State of Connecticut Community Investment Fund 2030

The CIF will award up to \$175 million each fiscal year. It will be awarded across two or more application periods per year. The fund is a statewide program authorized in Section 32-285a of the Connecticut General Statutes

WINTONBURY HILLS GOLF COURSE



Wintonbury Hills Golf Course is a Pete Dye designed golf course that opened in 2005. It is owned by the Town of Bloomfield and is a municipal facility that is open to the public.

It is regularly ranked in the top 3 courses in CT and in the top 20 nationally as a municipal facility.



The Wintonbury Hills Golf Course opened for the 2024 season on March 13, 2024. The course has a driving range that is located 400 yards from the main entrance and has its own parking lot. Range balls can be purchased directly at the range using any major credit card. The range is open 7 days a week during the season. There is also a large practice green located at the clubhouse and is free to use.

There are weekly ladies and beginner clinics, junior camps and get golf ready clinics planned for the spring and summer

The property also features the Tap Inn Pub, which is open 7 days a week and is a great meeting place after a round. They also provide catering services for birthday, retirements, and weddings.

FROM THE ASSESSORS OFFICE

Applications for Tax Credits Elderly and Totally Disabled Homeowners

Filings accepted February 1 until May 15, 2024

State law provides a property tax credit program for Connecticut owners in residence of real property, who are elderly (65 and over) or totally disabled, and whose annual incomes do not exceed certain limits. The amount of the credit that may be granted is up to \$1,250 for married couples and \$1,000 for single persons. Credit amounts are based on a graduated income scale.

Motor Vehicle Tax Information

Prior to the distribution of July tax bills, if any vehicle has been sold/totaled/donated/junked/repossessed/registered out of state or stolen please present the necessary paperwork and submit the documentation to the Assessor's office to adjust your bills, if applicable.

Additional Veteran's Exemptions

February 1 until October 1, 2024

Additional Veteran Benefits are available to income qualified veterans. To qualify, an application must be filed biennially with the Assessor's office between February 1 and October 1.





registration penalty for each month that a dog has been unregistered. Licenses may be obtained provided that you have a current rabies certificate and a verification of your dog having been neutered or spayed, if applicable. The fee for a spayed/neutered dog is \$8.00, and the fee for a non-spayed/non-neutered dog is \$19.00.

Anyone over the age of 16 is required to obtain a fishing license, available in the Town Clerk's Office. No license is required for youth under the age of 16, as long as they are accompanied by an adult who holds a current fishing license. A list of fees can be found on the Town Clerk's webpage. Connecticut residents over the age of 65 can receive a license at no fee. The Trout and Salmon stamp is required for anyone fishing in a Trout Management Area, Wild Trout Management Area, Trout Park, or Atlantic Salmon Broodstock Area, and the cost is \$5.00.

All dogs 6 months and older must be licensed in the town in which they reside. All dogs shall be licensed in the month of June or penalties apply. Beginning July 1, there is a \$1.00
